

LOANSOME DOC FACTSHEET

Loansome Doc is the system for electronically ordering full text documents identified while searching the National Library of Medicine's databases at PubMed (<http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/PubMed>).

There is no charge for Internet access to PubMed. However, to participate in Loansome Doc requires registering with a participating library, such as Borland Health Science Library, and Request-A-Copy fees apply. You must fill out the Loansome Doc Registration Form before access is granted.

Loansome Doc requests are retrieved twice daily, at 10:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. The requests available locally will be processed and sent within 24 hours of retrieval. Articles can be delivered via email, campus mail, U.S. Mail or fax (a fax surcharge may apply), depending on the user specification. Requests not available locally and approved to be forwarded to other locations (interlibrary loan) can be obtained but require more time, usually 7 to 10 days.

Charges for Request-A-Copy are as follows:

Affiliated Users:

For articles retrieved on site: \$5:00 article

Fax charge: no charge for local phone numbers

All other sources (interlibrary loan): \$14.00/article or actual cost if over \$14.00

Fax charge: additional \$5.00/article

Unaffiliated Users:

For articles retrieved on site: \$7.00/article

Fax charge: additional \$5.00/article

All other sources (interlibrary loan): Not Available

Affiliation with the Borland Library may be established for users who are not affiliated with a corporate member of the Library or UFHSC/Jacksonville.
